SPC Block was assigned as a driver for C Team, 1st squad, 2nd platoon "Punishers."

Block was born in Beaumont, Texas on 4 August 1987. She entered into the Army in July 2005 when she enlisted and reported to Alpha Company, 795th Military Police Battalion for One Station Unit Training at Fort Leo-

nard Wood, Missouri.

After graduating OSUT in November 2005, she was assigned to the 142d Military Police Company, 94th Military Police Battalion, Yongsan Army Garrison, South Korea. After completing her duty in Korea, she was



eration Iraqi Freedom 07-09 and was soon thereafter awarded the 89th Military Police Brigade Shoulder Sleeve Insignia Former Wartime Service or "Combat Patch."

Block's military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal (posthumous), Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon and the Overseas Service Ribbon.

She is survived by her parents, Jerry and Jane Block of Vidor, Texas.

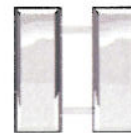

SPC Kamisha Block will forever be missed. She was a kind soul and a fine Soldier. The company is dealing with this tragedy the only way we can ~ together. The team is strong. The 92nd MP BN arranged a fitting memorial for SPC Block and provided the Gunfighters an opportunity to grieve together and find closure. We offer our condolences and sympathies to the Block Family.

Despite this unexpected loss, the Gunfighter troopers executed their mission extremely well. First Platoon executed an operation with their assigned Iraqi Police Stations and 2nd Battalion, 32nd Field Artillery. The "Warfighters," along with a squad from 2nd Platoon, supported the Iraqi Police security plan to protect Iraqi pilgrims as they moved on foot through Baghdad to the Khadamiyah mosque in N. Baghdad. The operation was a success and greatly synchronized many of the various security elements in W. Baghdad. The "War-fighters" closed out their month by detaining a high profile insurgent leader in to Coalition custody.

2nd Platoon continues to train the Iraqi Police in the remote area of Abu Ghraib. The "Punishers" are preparing to receive and train nearly 1000 new policemen to their area. This will likely be a main Coalition focus over the coming months.

3rd Platoon focused their efforts on the extremely volatile area of Amariyah, Baghdad. The "Hooligan" troopers provided a capabilities overview to potential police recruits at the Iraqi Army Camp Hawk in Arabic. The platoon lead-

ership is heavily involved with 1st Battalion, 64th Armor in planning future operations for their assigned area.

Headquarters Soldier continue to provide quality, professional support to all the Gunfighters. They are always the first to offer their services to the line platoons. So far, "Workhorse" troopers have processed 72 awards, repaired 140 weapons problems, fixed 301 trucks issues, solved countless communications problems, and ordered \$140,000 worth of supplies.

Your Soldier is doing such a fine job everyday. This is a tough mission in a hot and nasty country, but the Gunfighters have hit a stride and found their rhythm. I am so proud to be in command of these warriors and humbled by their daily acts of courage and selflessness. Thank you for your constant support.

The last month for MSG Keene and his Operations Cell has been quite busy supporting the company's day to day operations. They welcomed SSG Stanifer and CPL Schultz into the theater and SPC True moved over from the second platoon. SSG Stanifer, CPL Schultz, and SPC True hit the ground running. SSG Stanifer and SPC True assisted first platoon in support of OPERATION OVERWATCH during the Kadamiyah March. The two of them were sent to FOB Honor to teach the Iraqi Security Forces how to battle track their patrols, report significant acts, and coordinate movement of the patrols. CPL Schultz assumed her role as the 401st MP Company Senior Medic. Since arriving in

country, CPL Schultz has been busy receiving the company's medical supplies and distributing them out to the line platoon medics and conducting sick call for the company. 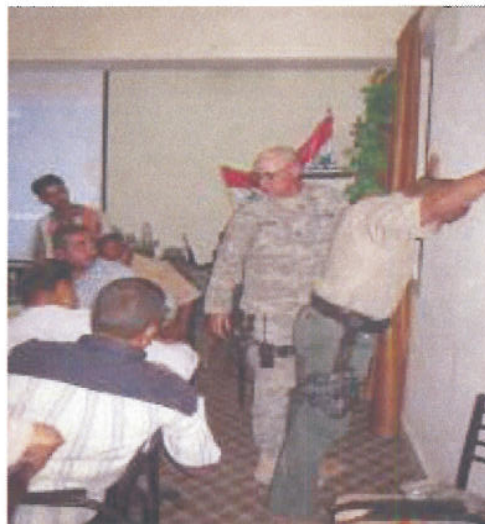

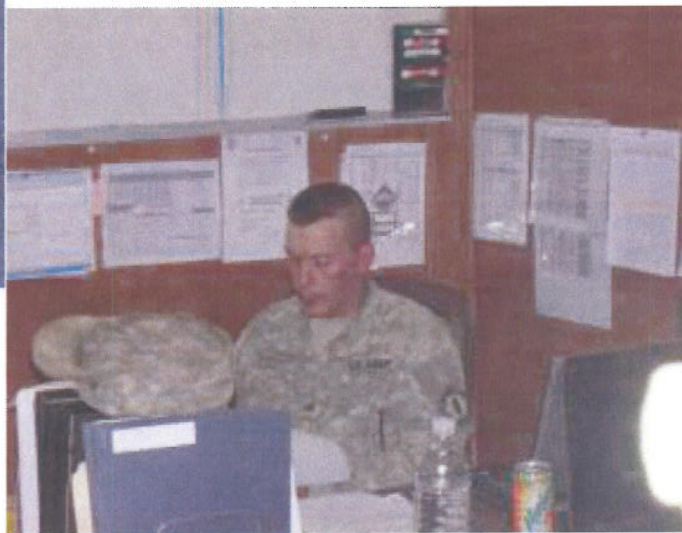
FROM THE HORSE: A WORKHORSE report
