Since this is a site developed and supported by DOD; certain controls are emplaced to ensure access is granted to Soldiers, Family and Friends of the 401st MP Company.

First step was to develop the database of Soldiers assigned to the unit which has been completed.

The next step is to get Soldiers and FRG Members subscribed. There are two ways to do this.

1st option: Soldier Sponsered

Soldier subscription to the web site and adding / inviting those members the Soldier wishes to sponsor. The steps for doing this have been provided to the unit and hopefully Soldiers will start the ball rolling.; because this is the easiest way to ensure immediate access to the site.

2nd option: Self Register

1. Go to www.armyfrg.org

- 2. Click "Register Here"
- Select "Texas" from the display map
- Scroll down to Fort Hood Community and then 720th MP Battalion
- Select subscribe as a Family Member
- Enter information in the blocks provided

You will need to know Soldiers Name as shown on the official roles (Christopher not Chris) and last four of the Soldiers SSN.

 If Soldier is found in database you will complete registration by entering more information.

> The Site Administrator will be notified of the request and access will be granted after verification.

8. If Soldier is not found in the data-

base a prompt will go to the Site Administrator of Soldier not found. This may happen due to error of inputting information (misspelling, transposing, etc...) or error on subscribers part.

If you are self registering it may take up to 3-5 business days for the Site Administrator to verify that the Soldier is willing to sponsor your access.

The Site Administrator is located here on Ft. Hood but contact with the unit and the Soldier must be made before authorizing access.

With all that technical information said; encourage your Soldier to subscribe first and add you to their invite list.

Either way every effort will be made to get you into the site and viewing the information available.


